## Initial Consultation Report Tara A. Fantauzzi, Professional Genealogist

Subjects of Focus: Identity of Marietta Tenaglia Furia – Specific Place of Origin

The purpose of this report is to summarize the data and goals for your project. Please review the information in this report carefully and report if any additional information is known at project start or if any of the information should be changed or corrected.

Client has a desire to establish and prove a specific place of origin for Marietta Tenaglia reported to have been born at an unspecified location in Italy on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of May 1881 to John (Giovanni) Tenaglia and Antoinetta Pellegrini. Marietta later married Benny (Benigno) Furia in Philadelphia during 1901. The couple had at least six children; Eusebio Furia, Edward Furia, Fred Furia, Ernano Furia, Angelina Furia and Eda Furia.

Client submitted a copy of a 1920 Federal population census taken in Philadelphia, Philadelphia County, Pennsylvania on the 14<sup>th</sup> of January that year for the household of Benny Furia. On the record Marietta Furia reported she migrated to the United States circa 1897. A copy of her original migration record has not been obtained yet.

A copy of an original death record was submitted for Marietta Furia to verify and prove she died on the 21<sup>st</sup> of January 1956 in Philadelphia, Philadelphia County, Pennsylvania. On her death record the death informant Edward Furia reported the deceased was born on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of May 1881 to John Tenaglia and Antoinette Pellegrini.

## Summary of Research Recommendations:

Genealogist recommends applying up to one and a half hours of research time completing a digital collections survey on the identity of Marietta Tenaglia Furia with a goal to search for documentation that may report her specific place of birth. If genealogist searches for documentation on her identity and is unable to find a record that reports her specific place of origin genealogist will next focus research time on siblings to Marietta Tenaglia Furia. If she had any brothers or sisters who migrated later in time, there is a higher probability documentation their identity (identities) may report a specific place of origin in Italy. Genealogist must establish a place of origin in Italy from American documentation before a copy of an original Italian birth record for Marietta Tenaglia Furia may be searched and obtained.

A *Digital Collections Survey* is a term we use to describe a research survey that exhausts all available collections of documents that are published online including but not limited

to Ancestry.com and other premium information service databases. Copies of original documentation may include census, vital, military, probate, land and church records; secondary documentation may include copies of record transcriptions, record index entries and published genealogies.

## Itemized List of Research Recommendations:

- 1. Digital Collections Survey, Up to 1.5 hours research time
  - Research survey on the identity of Marietta Tenaglia Furia to establish and prove her specific place of origin (identities of siblings may be investigated if records found on Marietta do not report her specific place of origin) that will search all available collections of documents that are published online including but not limited to Ancestry.com premium databases. Copies of original documentation may include census, vital, military, probate, land and church records; secondary documentation may include copies of record transcriptions, record index entries and published genealogies.
