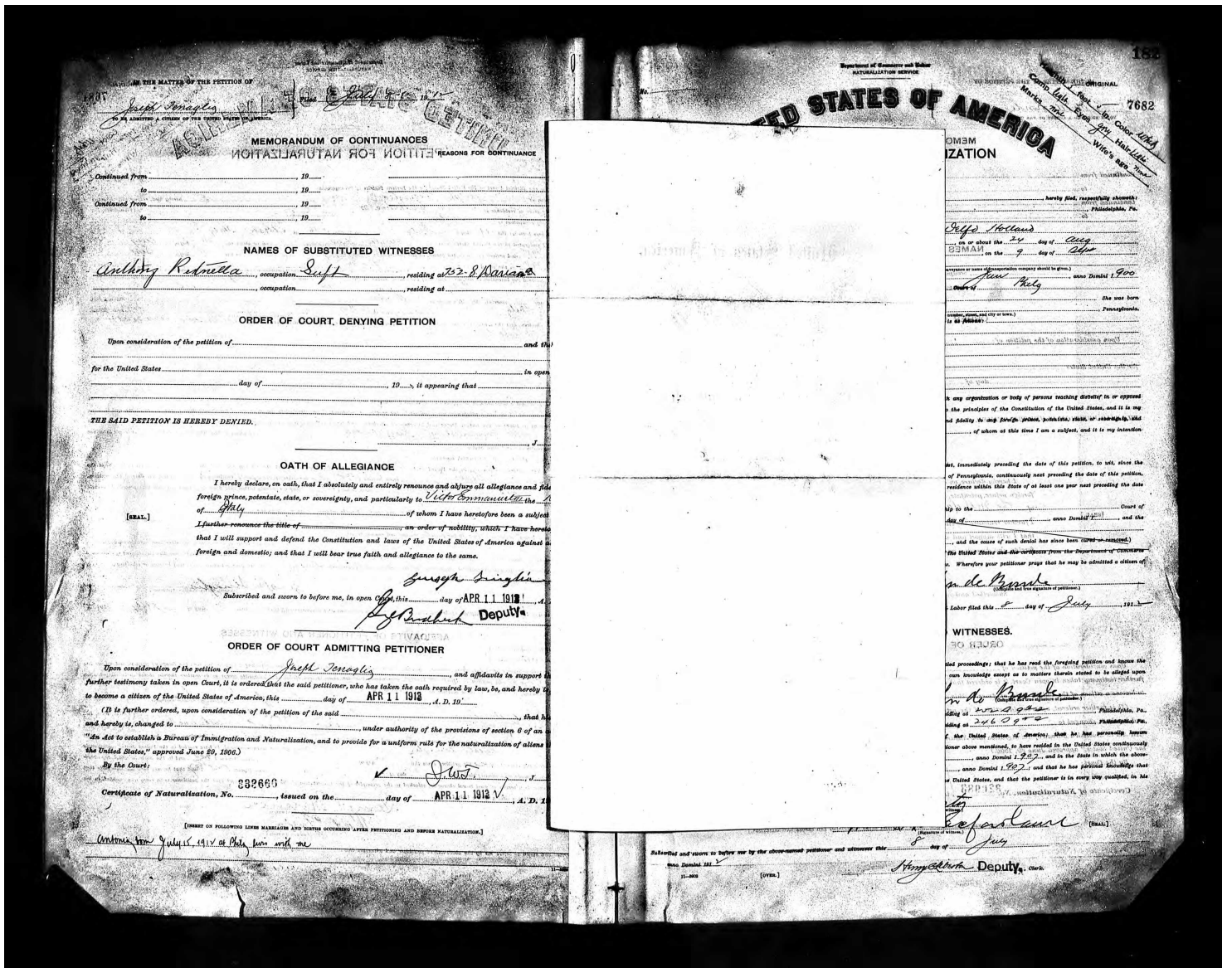

To the Honorable the District Court of the United States for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania:  
The petitioner is Joseph Tenaglia (give number and street) Philadelphia, Pa.  
born. My place of residence is Philadelphia, Pa.  
I was born on the 18 day of July 1877 at Alzano, Italy  
I emigrated to the United States from Alzano, Italy on or about the 10 day of Sept  
anno Domini 1897, and arrived in the United States at the port of Philadelphia on the 10 day of Sept  
anno Domini 1897, on the vessel Keese  
I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 10 day of Sept  
anno Domini 1897 in the 1st Court of US  
I am single married. My wife's name is Catharine and her name at birth is Catharine  
I have one children and the name, date and place of birth, and place of residence of each of said children is as follows: Joseph Tenaglia born March 1905  
Philadelphia, Pa.

Fourth. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist or a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to Victor Emmanuel III, King of Italy of whom at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.  
Fifth. I am able to speak the English language.  
Sixth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least, immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 10 day of Sept anno Domini 1897, and in the State of Pennsylvania, continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the 10 day of Sept anno Domini 1897, being a resident within this State at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.  
Seventh. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court. (I made petition for citizenship to the 1st Court of US and the said petition was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit, and the cause of each denial has since been cured or removed)  
Eighth. Attached hereto and made a part of this petition are my declarations of intention to become a citizen of the United States and the certificate from the Department of Commerce and Labor, together with my affidavit and the affidavits of the two verifying witnesses therein, required by law. Therefore your petitioner prays that he may be admitted a citizen of the United States of America.  
Declaration of Intention and Certificate of Arrival: From Department of Commerce and Labor filed this 10 day of July, 1912.
